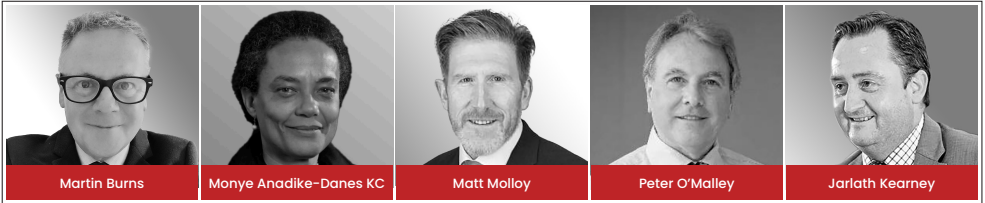

Conflict Avoidance – Martin Burns
